- ² A) Six hours from English literature, history, humanities, philosophy, or two semesters of one foreign language; any courses in art history, music history, or theatre history may also be accepted in fulfillment of the humanities requirement: ENGL 2413, 2423, 2613, 2623, 2723, 2813, 2823; HIST 1333, 1433, 3133; HUMN 2013, 2023, 2033, 2043, 2053; PHIL 1033, 1533, 2033, 2233, 2633; FREN 1134, 1234; GERM 1134, 1234; SPAN 1134, 1234, **AND:**
B) Three hours from: ART 1113, 1123, 1313, 1413; MUSC 1001, 1021, 1071, 1033, 1603/1601; MCOM 2213; THEA 1403, 1503.

- ⁷ In order to matriculate in the upper division business curriculum, students must complete the DCOBA Admissions Application to be admitted. Additionally, students must complete all nine (27 semester hours) of the business core courses with an overall GPA on those courses of 2.2, and have completed an additional 21 hours in the university core.
